
Phonic Decoding

Explain how 'hook', 'look' share a common Sound of '..ook'


Onset Variation: 'br' as in 'brook' | 'sh' as in 'shook'

Try These New Words


hook look cook shook brook jumped fish threw walked

To catch a fish that we can cook.




We got to the brook and had a look.
